CONCLUSIONS

The results of this study indicate that the majority of patients with acute myocardial infarction who survive the first 24 hours after onset of symptoms, and who are treated with aspirin, streptokinase, and beta-blockers, have a significantly better prognosis than those who are not treated with these agents.

The use of aspirin, streptokinase, and beta-blockers in the treatment of acute myocardial infarction is supported by the results of this study. The use of these agents is associated with a significantly better prognosis than that of patients who are not treated with these agents.

Aspirin	1000 mg daily	100
Streptokinase	1.5 million units daily	100
Beta-blockers	10 mg daily	100
Control	None	100

The results of this study indicate that the majority of patients with acute myocardial infarction who survive the first 24 hours after onset of symptoms, and who are treated with aspirin, streptokinase, and beta-blockers, have a significantly better prognosis than those who are not treated with these agents.
